

Are you having or have you ever had pelvic radiotherapy?

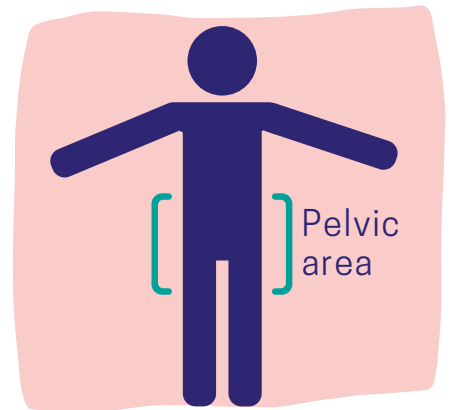


Most people will experience some side effects during pelvic radiotherapy treatment. These symptoms often settle during the first few weeks after radiotherapy finishes.

Symptoms that start or continue three months or more, after the end of radiotherapy, are known as Pelvic Radiation Disease (PRD).

After your pelvic radiotherapy, have you had:

- Poor control of your bowels and/ or bladder?
- Bleeding from bowel and/or bladder?
- Effects on your sex life, menopause and/or fertility?
- Other symptoms, such as pain, swelling, numbness?
- Psychological concerns?
- Other symptoms that interfere with your life?



If the answer is YES to any of these questions, you may have (or be at risk of) Pelvic Radiation Disease and may need specialist support
